TODAY'S READINGS

CHANGE OUR LIVES

The letters of Paul to the Thessalonians are among his earliest writings, and are driven by his belief and the belief of the entire early Christian community that the return of Christ was imminent, and that devoting time or attention to anything else was foolish.

As time progressed, this fervor subsided a bit. Today we may wonder, when we hear these readings about the coming end-times, if we should take them to heart, if we really believe that Christ still may come upon us as a "thief at night" (1 Thessalonians 5:2). Does this mean that we are to stop our long-range goal-setting, get rid of our yearly calendars and planners, or stop putting money in the college education fund? Of course not. What it does mean is that we need to change our lives, living like children of the light and illuminating the world around us with the light of the gospel. Then, on that day, when the details of our daily living become unimportant, we will be ready to find our peace and security in Christ Jesus.

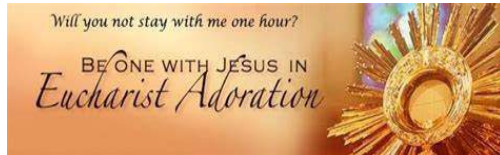

Fr. John Hardon, S.J. tells us in this book The Blessed Sacrament, that an apostle of the Eucharist is one who is personally very devoted to the Holy Eucharist as *Real Presence*, as *Sacrifice of the Mass*, and as *Holy Communion*. Christ will use us as channels of His grace to others.

An apostle of the Eucharist is one who realizes that there is no solution to the problems of the world or the problems of the Church except through the Holy Eucharist. An apostle of the Eucharist is one who does everything in his or her power, by word and example to promote a deeper faith in the Eucharist. An apostle of the Eucharist prays for a deeper understanding of the Blessed Sacrament, especially among priests. Pray, pray for us priests!

An apostle of the Eucharist lives a life of reparation for those who neglect the Blessed Sacrament, i.e., When others do not go to Mass, you go when you don't have to. When others don't come to adore Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, you come to make reparation for them. An apostle of the Eucharist is zealous to convert or reconvert people to the Catholic Faith. An apostle of the Eucharist simply expects the Eucharistic Christ to work miracles. Jesus wants to perform miracles, especially the miraculous conversion of the unbelievers to believers in Jesus Christ and the conversion of sinners. An apostle of the Eucharist has no illusions: there will be opposition.

All of this depends on our faith. And we grow in our faith only in the measure that we grasp the meaning and the understanding of what we believe.
