Lenten Regulations

ABSTINENCE FROM MEAT: Catholics in the United States age 14 and older (with no maximum age) are obliged to abstain from meat on ASH WEDNESDAY (February 22), the FRIDAYS OF LENT and GOOD FRIDAY. Church law forbids consuming meat, but does not prohibit eggs, milk products, or condiments made with animal fat.

FASTING: Catholics in the United States, from the day after their 18th birthday until the day after their 59th birthday, are obliged to fast on ASH WEDNESDAY and GOOD FRIDAY. Church law allows for only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit the taking of some food in the morning and evening. The combined quantity of the two meals should not exceed the quantity eaten at the full meal. The drinking of ordinary liquids does not break the fast. Note: People taking medications or with health concerns should follow their doctor's advice on fasting. Catholics are also reminded they should fast from solid food one hour before receiving the Eucharist.

PRAYER AND ALMSGIVING: Abstinence and fasting should lead Catholics to a deeper prayer life. Almsgiving provides an opportunity for a deeper understanding and response to the needs of others – particularly the poor.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — Thus says the LORD GOD: I will open your graves, have you rise from them, and settle you on your land. (Ezekiel 37:12-14).

Psalm — The Lord is kind and saves us (Psalm 130).

Second Reading — If Christ is in you, the spirit is alive even if the body is dead because of sin (Romans 8:8-11).

Gospel — Lazarus, dead for four days, came out of his tomb when Jesus called his name. Many of those who had seen what had happened began to believe in Jesus (John 11:1-45 [3-7, 17, 20-27, 33b-45]).

LIFE FROM GOD

As we approach Holy Week, our readings speak of a God who, in the midst of death, brings new life to the people. In Ezekiel, we hear that God will open the graves of the people of Israel, who faced near extinction. In the Gospel of John, Jesus gives new life to Lazarus in a manner that prefigures the resurrection of Jesus. Paul tells the Romans that in Christ, God will not only give life to our bodies after death, but God offers us abundant life here and now. We observe that the external conditions for the people described in these readings did not radically change. Israel was still in exile. Lazarus would eventually face death again. But now God's presence and power are revealed. Even when our situation in life is difficult and perhaps not likely to change soon, we remember that the Spirit dwells within us.



You are invited to join the Rosary Group, which meets every Tuesday evening 6—7 pm in the church. The Rosary and Divine Mercy Chaplet are prayed as well as a prayer for priests and the unborn, with special intentions to St. Anthony and a prayer of abandonment. 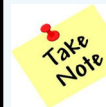

SAVE SOULS and BUILD WORLD PEACE by First Saturday Devotion to Mary's Immaculate Heart. The Virgin Mary asked us, through Fatima, to make Reparation to Her Immaculate Heart by doing the following on the First Saturday of the month with the intention of making reparation to Her Immaculate Heart:

1. Attend mass and receive Holy Communion
2. Pray 5 decades of the Holy Rosary
3. Keep Our Lady Company for 15 minutes while meditating on the mysteries of the Holy Rosary
4. Go to Confession especially for this devotion (can be done up to 10 days before or after the First Saturday)

St. Joseph the Worker Parish will host First Saturday Devotion on **April 1st**. Rosary at 7:00 AM, Mass at 7:30, Meditation immediately following mass. Mary told Sister Lucy, "I promise to assist at the hour of death with all the graces necessary for salvation all those who on the first Saturday of five consecutive months, go to Confession and receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary and keep me company for a quarter of an hour while meditating on the mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to me."
