YOU ARE NOT ALONE

Eucharistic Adoration is simply worshipping the Real Presence of Jesus, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity, truly present in the Consecrated Host (the Blessed Sacrament). It is an extension of the Mass.

Renae Kranz wrote in The Bishop's Bulletin, Catholic Diocese of Sioux Falls:

"I have lots of excuses not to go to Eucharistic Adoration: I'm afraid of committing. I'm too lazy, too busy, have to work, it's too early, too late, right in the middle of the day, and what would I do for an entire hour anyway?

I don't think I'm alone in those excuses. But then the disappointed words of our Savior to the Apostles in the Garden of Gethsemane ring in my ears as if He's saying them directly to me:

"You could not keep watch with me for one hour?" (Mark 14:37)

His words cut to the heart of it. I think it's way past time for me to go to Adoration."

Like the title of this article states, if any of your excuses mirror Renae's, **You Are Not Alone**. Hopefully, you will follow her lead and make time to visit Jesus in the Adoration Chapel.

There are currently **only five more Guardians needed to open Saturday afternoon: Noon to 1PM, 1PM to 2PM, and 2PM – 3PM**. There are also several Guardians who would be thrilled to have a partner. A chart of the hours available is in the vestibule of the Chapel. Check it out and pick up a copy of the list when you go to visit Jesus. Instructions on how to become a Registered Guardian are detailed there.

You are invited by Jesus and St. Faustina to join in praying the Divine Mercy Novena, which begins on **Good Friday, March 29**, and concludes on **Saturday, April 6**. The celebration of the Feast of Divine Mercy takes place Sunday, April 7, at Sacred Heart of Mary's Parish, 2:00-4:00 p.m.

What is the Divine Mercy Novena?

Jesus appeared to St. Faustina, a Polish nun, and gave her the prayers for the Divine Mercy Novena, a 9-day prayer that leads up to Divine Mercy Sunday. What makes this novena unique is that Jesus composed the petitions.

Day 1: "Bring to Me all mankind, especially all sinners."

Day 2: "Bring to Me the Souls of Priests and Religious."

Day 3: "Bring to Me all Devout and Faithful Souls."

Day 4: "Bring to Me those who do not believe in God and those who do not know Me."

Day 5: "Bring to Me the Souls of those who have separated themselves from My Church."

Day 6: "Bring to Me the Meek and Humble Souls and the Souls of Little Children."

Day 7: "Bring to Me the Souls who especially venerate and glorify My Mercy."

Day 8: "Bring to Me the Souls in Purgatory."

Day 9: "Bring to Me the Souls who have become lukewarm."

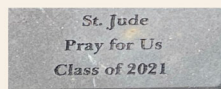

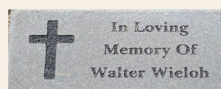
