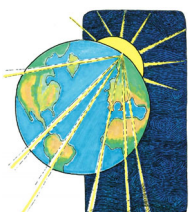

First Reading — You humble of the land, seek justice and humility, and the Lord will be your protection (Zephaniah 2:3; 3:12-13).

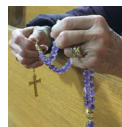
Psalm — The Lord blesses the humble and gives them the heavenly kingdom (Psalm 146).

THE PEOPLE OF GOD'S KINGDOM

In our Gospel reading from Matthew, we hear the Beatitudes, the stirring opening to the Sermon on the Mount. Jesus is proclaiming the coming of the kingdom of God, and begins by considering what kind of people will enter and participate in this kingdom. They are the poor in spirit, the meek, the clean of heart, the peacemakers. We hear both Zephaniah and Paul echo this, as God specifically chooses the weak and the lowly to be God's agents in ushering in the reign of God. By living with humility and integrity, their hearts are open to being transformed by the grace of God. We too are called to live in this way. Jesus invites us to be people with open hearts, to receive God's blessing. And working through us, God may bless all of creation.

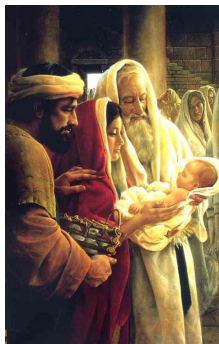

Revisit the Presentation of the Lord



The Presentation of the Lord is celebrated on February 2nd and is 40 days after Christmas. On this day, we celebrate the presentation of Jesus in the Temple in Jerusalem. According to Jewish law at that time, the first born son belonged to God. Parents of the first born male child were expected to offer a sacrifice when they presented their child in the Temple. When Mary and Joseph presented Jesus, they offered a sacrifice of two turtledoves. They met a man named Simeon who instantly recognized Baby Jesus as the Messiah. They also met Anna, a prophetess. "At that moment, she came and began to speak about the child to all who were looking for the redemption of Jerusalem" (Luke 2:38).

This day is also known as Candlemas Day, the day on which candles are blessed symbolizing Christ who is the "Light of the World."

Revisit this day when Mary, Joseph, Simeon, and Anna gazed upon Baby Jesus, the Light of the World, when He was presented in the Temple by visiting the Adoration Chapel. You, too, can gaze upon the "Light of the World" in the Blessed Sacrament, the True Presence of Jesus. Come out of the cold and feel Jesus lighten your soul and feel the warmth of His Love for you. Eucharist Adoration is open five days a week Monday – Friday 8 AM – 8 PM, and every Saturday morning 8 AM – Noon in the Communion of Saints Adoration Chapel.
