Men and women lay persons can stay under one roof provided they room separately. Clergy may only stay with clergy. You are welcome to house a minimum of two and a maximum of 15. Why Did He Wait So Long?



Jesus could have instituted Eucharist when He was twelve, or at the wedding in Cana, or when He was thirty years old and began to teach publicly, or after His Resurrection. But He chose instead to give us Himself at the last moment of His life in order that men might better see the extent of His love.

Imagine a father who has sacrificed everything he has for his children, and wants to show them how much he loves them. He gives them gifts throughout his life but saves their big inheritance until his deathbed. There he gives them all that he has worked for and accumulated to serve as a lasting memorial of his love and to make a deep and lasting impression on them.

Jesus thought and acted in the very same manner. He thought, I have already given men so many proofs of My love: I have created them; I have healed them; I have become man – for their sake; I have lived among them for more than thirty years; I am yet to suffer and die for them on the cross and to re-open Heaven for them; what more can I do for them? Ah! I will give them all that I have. I will give them Myself as a legacy; I will give them My Divinity and My Humanity, My Body and My Soul, Myself, entirely and without reserve so that they will understand and appreciate the depth of My Love. I will remain humbly in their midst forever in the Eucharist. I will be with them until the end of time! Why did He wait so long? Because He LOVES us. Let us return that love and let us not wait so long.

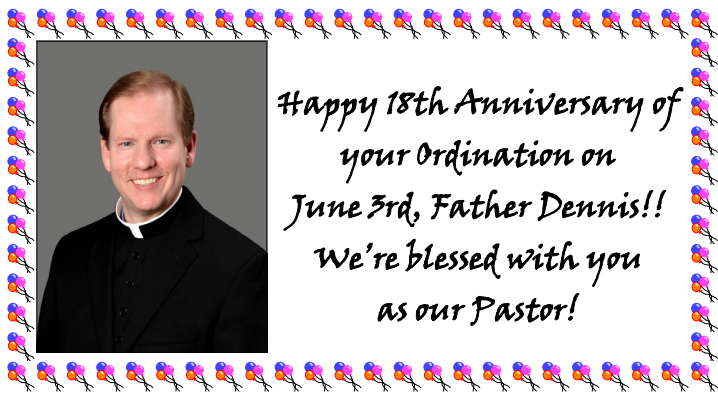

ABOUT THE INTERCESSOR

The route is named after St. Elizabeth Ann Seton, the first American-born saint to be canonized by the Catholic Church. A lifelong protestant, the young mother was drawn to the Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. St. Elizabeth Ann opened the first free Catholic school for girls in America in 1810. Her work laid the foundation for what is now the parochial school system.
