## ECLIPSE OF THE SON



Just last month the nation was in a tizzy and almost everyone was talking about the solar eclipse that was about to occur. People were traveling hundreds of miles to get a view of the moon crossing in front of the sun. For a mere 5+ minutes, there was darkness and the sun was obscured from view. People were in awe as they watched the event. They protected their eyes with special sunglasses. Emotions ran high and pundits on TV were commenting about how "Mother Nature" had provided such an historic and beautiful happening. It was estimated that over 100 million people witnessed the eclipse of the sun.

There is a striking, though sad, parallel between viewing the solar eclipse and viewing Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament in Adoration. Jesus is "obscured" from view by the appearance of the bread that the Host was made from. Without the bread, the best sunglasses in the world would not protect you as you viewed Jesus in His true glory. What you have is an Eclipse of the Son. It would be wonderful if those same 100 million folks were as excited to see Jesus and travel miles to visit Him in Adoration and become registered Guardians.

A third-grade daughter of a friend renewed our hope in the younger generation when she was asked if she saw the eclipse. She answered "Yes." When asked how it happened, her answer wasn't Mother Nature, it was "God did it." Thank you, Riley.

What's more important, to see a solar eclipse or visit the Creator of the Universe, the One who created the eclipse?

Jesus waits for you in the Adoration Chapel. See the miracle of the **Eclipse of the Son**, available every day.

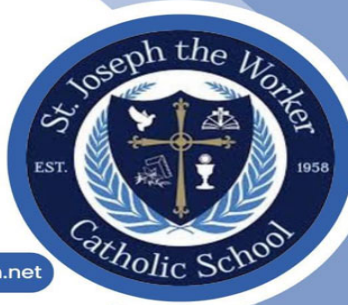
